1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The above named Clubs, hereafter called the PROMOTERS will conduct Rounds 1 – 6 of 2008 DIRT ACTION AMCROSS INTERCLUB SERIES for both junior and amateur riders who are members of the above named Clubs, at the grass track natural terrain venues on the dates specified.

2. JURISDICTION:

2.1. The abovementioned meetings have been authorised by Motorcycling NSW Limited (MNSW) who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permits and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia, Club or National Competition Licences. One day licences will be permitted subject to: -

(a) Licence must be issued prior to day of event and be valid for date of event, fee \$60.00.

(b) Supporting booklet duly signed; with one-day licence is presented at sign on.

(c) No testing on day of event.

2.2 Age requirements for junior riders will be determined as at 1/1/2008 refer GCR 12.16.0.1

2.3 Each junior rider will be required to present current log book at sign on.

2.4. The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs), these Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of MNSW and any Final Instructions.

**BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES,
REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.**

3. ENTRIES:

- 3.1. Entries open six weeks prior to and close last mail 10 days prior to the meeting date, RECEIVAL date determines acceptance when classes are full.
- 3.2. Current membership card, from one of the promoting clubs, must be presented at registration, for each meeting.
- 3.3. In the case of postponement or abandonment of any meeting, the Promoter may retain all or any part of the entry fee for that meeting, if such retention is approved by MNSW.
- 3.4. Only entries received on the official Entry Form that and accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 3.5. **NOTE:** - LATE ENTRIES AND THE RETURN OF ENTRY FEES IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE PROMOTER, NO ENTRIES ON THE DAY. A late entry fee of \$20.00 will be applied also an administration fee of \$10.00 for cancellations after closing date.

4. INSURANCE:

- 4.1. National Capital Benefits Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 4.2. Personal Accident and Ambulance Insurance is the responsibility of the individual.
- 4.3. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT SUCH INSURANCE COVER.

5. MEDICAL SERVICES:

Suitably qualified medical personnel will be in attendance from the commencement of practice until the completion of racing.

6. ENTRY FEE:

- 6.1. **JUNIOR \$55.00 SENIOR \$65.00 PER CLASS. Additional Class \$35.00**
- 6.2. Payment by Cheque, Money Order or Cash. ANY FEES FOR DISHONOURED CHEQUES WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT.
- 6.3. Cheques and Money Orders are to be made payable to the Promoting Club.
- 6.4. Confirmation of entry and the issuing of any Final Instructions WILL BE POSTED ON WEBSITE.

7. PASSES:

No passes will be issued, refer to promoting club website for acceptances and final instructions.

Riders will need to sign an attendance sheet immediately following riders briefing

8. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

SATURDAY JUNIORS ONLY

250cc Four Stroke 13/14/15yrs

Up to 125cc 2 Stroke 13/14/15yrs

85cc 14/15yrs 2 Stroke includes and 150cc 4 stroke (standard or big wheels)

85cc 12/13yrs 2 Stroke includes and 150cc 4 stroke (standard or big wheels)

85cc 9/11yrs 2 Stroke includes and 150cc 4 stroke fitted with standard wheels only

65cc 10/12yrs 2 stroke) 4 stroke machines as per GCR 12 16.1.1.a

65cc 7/9yrs 2 stroke)

Parents All Powers (For a parent to ride they must have a legally recognised child riding in the same event or have ridden at a previous meeting in the series)

Ladies All Powers

A&B LITES, A&B OPEN

Those classes which are substantially over subscribed, entries will be randomly divided into two groups and run as separate races. (Except for final round where selection will be on cumulative point score)

Small entry classes may be run in conjunction with another similar small entry class.

Ladies & over 45's will be on the same grid, A&B Lites and Open will be on the same grid.

9. AWARDS:

As per G.C.R 5.8.9 points will be awarded for each race, on basis of 25 points for winner of each race.

Series trophies only will be presented up to the first ten qualifiers in each class.

Riders must compete in minimum of 4 (four) rounds to qualify for a trophy.

Accumulative points will determine the Series placing's.

Individual Clubs may award trophies or similar for their round.

MARGARET WATSON TROPHIES (Male and Female) will be awarded to the rider who scores the highest cumulative number of points in any one class over the series, max 450 points

10 ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 10.1. To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class shall be 15.
- 10.2. Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the Promoter.

11. RACE FORMAT:

- 11.1. All classes will be over 3-x 10min races or equivalent number of laps.
The actual race times will be at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, depending on the circumstances on the day.
- 11.2. **Series:** Scoring will be as per GCRs, for each race, i.e. 25 points will be allocated to the 1st place at the end of each race, 22 pts for 2nd place, 20 pts for 3rd place, 18 points for 4th place, 16 points for 5th place, etc, to be accumulated over the six rounds, with the maximum possible being 450 points achieved per class for the Series.

12. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 12.1. All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Motocross Competition.
- 12.2. Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 12.3. In the event of bike failure, permission to substitute a machine in entered class will be made by the Clerk of Course. Substitute machine must have passed machine examination and be of no greater capacity than the substituted machine.

13. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 13.1. Competitors will be allocated their Riding Number at Round 1 which will be retained for the entire series, unallocated numbers will be used for those riders who enter after Round 1 or change classes, allocated numbers take priority over any other numbers.
- 13.2. Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the GCRs, particular attention quality of the numbers.
- 13.3. Back numbers are to be worn.

14. GRID POSITIONS:

Selection of grid position will be determined by pegs for the first moto, then places from previous moto for subsequent motos on the day.

Round 6 - selection for first moto will be from cumulative point scores for Series to date. Subsequent motos will be from placing in previous moto.

15. RIDERS BRIEFING:

A Riders' Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of practice and ALL Competitors MUST attend and sign attendance record.

16 DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

By order of MNSW, random drug &/or alcohol testing of participants (i.e. officials, competitors, mechanics, pit crew and any other person associated with the control, direction and operation of the competition) may take place prior to, or at any time during this meeting.

17. CODE OF CONDUCT:

All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the current GCRs) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and shall be enforced.

*For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 7.00am **Saturday & 7am Sunday** with the completion of the meeting for the participant being at the completion of the participant's racing schedule.*

19. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

All natural terrain motocross track.

20. STARTS:

40 backward falling individual gates.

MX PROCEDURE – A 10 Second Board will be displayed to all riders. At the end of 10 seconds a 5 second board will be displayed. After a full 5 seconds, but not exceeding 10 seconds, the gates will drop.

21. NOISE: All machines must comply with the requirements of the GCRs and the Track Licence.

Random testing of machines may take place at any time during the meeting.

22. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

22.1 No Series Entry Forms - entries to be sent to Organising Promoter on that Promoter's Entry Form.

22.2 Presentation of awards will take place during the final round.

22.3 Full catering service including breakfast will be available at each venue.

22.4 Parents who ride on Saturday cannot ride on Sunday; purpose is to create family interest not to afford extra practice.

22.5 **Junior age as at 1st January**

22.7 All riders under 18 years ensure **THIRD PARTY INDEMNITY** is signed on back of entry form and if required

22.8 Riders must be prepared to undertake flag marshal duties or provide a suitable alternative; this particularly applies to those seniors who have entered more than one class.
